David's Refuge 5K Run/Walk: David's Refuge is a nonprofit based in Central New York. They have offices in Liverpool, Syracuse, and Rochester. They serve caregivers that have children with special needs or life-threatening medical conditions. It was founded in 2012, and serves over a thousand families a year, across New York State, but mostly in Central and Western New York, and serves caregivers that are based in Marcellus. **Rebekah Andre** from David's Refuge is requesting permission to host a 5K run/walk fundraiser at Marcellus Park. The organization will coordinate with Willow Running. The event will be held on Saturday, July 25, 2026, with a start time around 8:00 AM. The organization will coordinate with the Village Police Department and Fire Department to ensure emergency vehicles will be on site. David's Refuge is requesting the use of pavilions during the event.

Proposed 12-month Moratorium on Solar Battery Storage Facilities: The Town Board would like to pass a local law that regulates solar battery storage facilities. The proposal is to put a moratorium in place to allow the Planning and Zoning Board time to research this topic then make a recommendation to Town Board.

Highway Department: Mike Ossit, Highway Superintendent; the Highway Department staff took a dig-safe course. Assemblyman John Lemondes held a press conference at the Highway Department to discuss CHIPS. All the equipment is holding up and the Highway Staff is doing a great job keeping the roads clear and safe, more salt may need to be ordered.

Parks and Recreation: Don MacLachlan, Park and Recreation Director; pavilion reservations have risen to 78. Applications for summer recreation employment have been coming in. Interviews are underway and many 2025 employees for the town have responded positively to returning for 2026. The 2026 Summer Recreation Brochure is nearly complete. Michele is working on Community Pass to upload all the program parameters. The goal is to have it available March 4th to the public. Paper copies will also be produced in-house next month. The park staff are working on getting the park ready for the upcoming season. The last moonlight walk was a success.

John MacLachlan is a proposed new park laborer hire.

Councilor Pollard inquired if money remains in the budget from the building line would it be transferred into the Building Reserve at the end of the year? **Dave**, yes it would but we had to spend money from that line on the doors and other repairs. There was nothing left to transfer to the reserve account.

NYSEG's Delivery Charge Resolution: A resolution passed by the Town of Cincinnatus is requesting immediate review of NYSEG's delivery rates and the lack of transparency behind them. Many Towns have passed similar resolutions. This resolution calls on the New York State Public Service Commission to investigate these escalating charges, require real cost controls, and protect rural communities like ours from being unfairly burdened. **Mr. Gascon** stated that this topic has been discussed at his firm and because the Public Service Commission is the one that sets the rates this resolution might not make an impact on change. After discussion between the Town Board members, it was decided to move forward with the resolution at the March 18, 2026, Workshop meeting.

Councilor Pollard requested a meeting with Counsel after the meeting.

NYSEG Delivery Charge Resolution:

**TOWN OF MARCELLUS
 TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION
 March 18, 2026**

**A RESOLUTION STRONGLY URGING IMMEDIATE REVIEW OF
 ELECTRIC DELIVERY CHARGES, DEMANDING IMPROVED COST
 CONTROLS AND TRANSPARENCY, AND AUTHORIZING FORMAL
 COMPLAINTS TO THE NEW YORK STATE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION REGARDING THE ESCALATING
 COST OF ELECTRICITY**

Councilor Pollard, made the following motion, which was seconded by Supervisor Attley, the following Resolution was put before the Town Board of the Town of Marcellus for its consideration:

WHEREAS, residents, seniors, and small businesses in the Town of Marcellus are experiencing unsustainable, repeated, and compounding increases in electric bills that are placing a growing financial strain on households and the local economy; and

WHEREAS, a substantial portion of these increases are not attributable to increased energy consumption, but to escalating delivery charges, fees, and approved rate adjustments imposed by the utility companies; and

WHEREAS, electric delivery charges and rate structures are regulated and approved by the New York State Public Service Commission, which is statutorily charged with ensuring that utility rates are just, reasonable, and affordable for ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has received complaints from residents who are struggling to afford basic electric service and who have expressed serious concern regarding the frequency, magnitude, and lack of transparency surrounding recent and ongoing rate increases; and

WHEREAS, rural and low-density communities such as the Town of Marcellus are disproportionately impacted by delivery charge increases and cost-recovery mechanisms that fail to adequately account for affordability, equity, and the cumulative burden placed on ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds that continued approval of rate increases without stronger cost controls, greater transparency, and meaningful affordability protections, is unacceptable and contrary to the public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Marcellus formally and strongly urges the New York State Public Service Commission to conduct a thorough and immediate review of electric delivery charges, rate increases, and cost-recovery practices applicable to utility customers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board calls upon the Public Service Commission to prioritize ratepayer affordability, demand greater transparency from the utility companies, and require demonstrable cost-containment and operational efficiency measures before approving any future rate increases; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board expressly opposes continued or automatic rate increases that shift rising operational, infrastructure, and administrative costs onto ratepayers without clear justification or adequate protection for rural communities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized and directed to submit formal complaints, written comments, and supporting documentation to the New York State Public Service

Commission on behalf of the Town and its residents, objecting to excessive electric costs and requesting regulatory intervention; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is directed to transmit copies of this resolution to the New York State Public Service Commission, the utility companies, the Governor of the State of New York, members of the New York State Legislature, and neighboring municipalities served by the utility companies, and to encourage coordinated action among affected towns; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Introductory Local Law No. A of 2026 (12) Month Moratorium on Battery Energy Storage Systems:

**TOWN OF MARCELLUS
TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION
March 18, 2026**

**TOWN OF MARCELLUS LOCAL LAW NO. A OF 2026
("A Local Law Imposing a Twelve (12) Month Moratorium on
Battery Energy Storage Systems within the Town of Marcellus")**

Councilor Berwald introduced proposed Local Law No. A-2026, titled "A Local Law Imposing a Twelve (12) Month Moratorium on Battery Energy Storage Systems within the Town of Marcellus", and made the following motion, which was seconded by Councilor Hoey:

WHEREAS, proposed Local Law No. A-2026 has been introduced and will be considered for enactment pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law and Town Law; and

WHEREAS, this proposed moratorium will enable the Town of Marcellus to undertake a review to comprehensively address the issues involved with battery energy storage systems within the Town of Marcellus, including but not limited to siting, establishment, placement, installation, construction, erection, modification and/or enlargement of said systems; and

WHEREAS, the Town recognizes the potential benefits and desirability of renewable forms of energy, including battery energy storage systems, but has determined that time and research are necessary to determine how to properly regulate such systems; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has deemed this moratorium urgent and immediately necessary in order to preserve the status quo while this issue is examined by the Town; and

WHEREAS, no other agency has the legal authority or jurisdiction to approve or directly undertake the enactment of a local law in the Town of Marcellus, such that there are no other involved agencies within the meaning of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) with respect to the proposed enactment of said Local Law; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of said Local Law is a Type II action for purposes of environmental review under SEQRA thus concluding the environmental review process.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED that the Town Board shall conduct a public hearing as to the enactment of proposed Local Law No. A-2026 at the Town Hall located at 22 East Main Street, Marcellus, New York on April 15, 2026, at 6:30 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, at which time all persons interested in the subject shall be heard; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED that notice of said public hearing shall be provided at least five (5) days prior to the date of said public hearing in a newspaper of general circulation within the Town of Marcellus; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED that pending action of this Local Law, the Town of Marcellus will neither accept nor process any application pertaining to battery energy storage systems.

Vision Insurance for Town Employees: Three plans were provided to the Town Board for vision insurance through Excellus; simply vision gold, simply vision platinum and simply vision platinum plus. The simply vision platinum plus has coverage for safety glasses for the subscriber only. After some discussion the Town Board selected simply vision platinum plus for vision insurance offered to employees. The cost for this plan is \$21.31 for employees, \$35.05 for employees plus spouse, \$36.42 for employees and child/children or \$47.75 for employees and family. All active full-time employees are eligible, and the Town will contribute 50% of the cost. The Town's portion for the vision insurance will be paid from the Tax Stabilization Reserve.

Councilor Berwald made a motion seconded by Supervisor Attley to select simply vision platinum plus as the vision insurance offered to employees and approved the Town to pay half of the monthly cost.
